PARENTS WEB IS LIVE!

All Saints' new RenWeb School Management Software gives parents a safe and easy way to keep "up-to-date" online. Once an account has been activated, parents can use RenWeb to:

- Check your child's attendance and homework
- View the school calendar to see all of the upcoming events
- View and print school directories and contact information
- Read daily announcements and news
- See the lunch menu and order lunch

Here's how to access our easy-to-use RenWeb ParentsWeb:

Go to Internet Explorer and type in the address of our school website at www.allsaintsschool.org.

Click on "ParentsWeb Login" found on the home page.

Log in as follows:

1. Click the First Time Users tab if this is your first time to log in to RenWeb. If this is not your first time, skip to Step 5.
2. Enter your email address that you provided to the school.
3. Click the "Remember My Email?" box if you would like for the login screen to automatically populate your email address on subsequent logins.
4. Click the "New User" button. You will receive an email containing your password within 3 minutes (to the email address you entered, which must be the same email address that you provided to the school).
5. Click the "Parents" tab.
6. Enter the password assigned.
7. Click the "Parent Login" button.

CHAPEL NOTES

We have been spending time for the last few weeks in the Gospel of Matthew during chapel. Matthew's Gospel shares with us many of Jesus' parables, including the sower and the seed, the wheat and the weeds, and the pearl of great value. It has been fun to share these stories in chapel.

Matthew became a most important Gospel text for first- and second-century Christians because it contains all of the elements important to the early church: the story about Jesus's miraculous conception; an explanation of the importance of liturgy, law, discipleship, and teaching; and an account of Jesus's life and death. It remains important to us today for these same reasons. I encourage you to spend some time in the Gospel of Matthew this week.

NOTES FROM THE NURSE

No new information on when the City of Lubbock Health Department will be able to provide an Immunization Clinic for H1N1 Flu vaccine. Best estimate is Mid-December.

The best defenses against the seasonal and H1N1 flu are:

1. Wash your hands frequently.
2. Cover coughs and sneezes with your sleeve or a tissue.
3. Stay home if you are sick.
4. Get your flu vaccinations- seasonal and H1N1.

Please email or call Nurse Lisa if your child is absent. Please notify Nurse Lisa before 9 am or as soon as possible. If the absence is due to illness, please include results from any testing performed (ex. strep or flu test). School Nurses have been asked to report weekly to the local Health Department the number of absences due to flu-like illness.

PARENTSWEB TIPS AND IDEAS

We are hearing great things from our families who have logged into RenWeb's online ParentsWeb. If you have not yet activated your ParentsWeb account, what are you waiting for? The time is now! Below are a couple of points of clarification regarding ParentsWeb:

LUNCH

We are pleased to report that parents can order lunch online through ParentsWeb. When you place a lunch order online, there may be a delay in the order appearing in red on your lunch calendar. (Web orders received will appear in red, to indicate that the order has been placed.) It may not show as being ordered until the next business morning. Orders placed through the teachers or in the office will not appear in red on your student's online calendar. This is a limitation of the RenWeb system, and we are working with them towards a possible solution.

Please also know that when ordering a lunch, the complete meal is \$5, which includes sides and milk/juice. Individual prices for water, juice, milk, etc. is included for those students who just want to purchase individual items. For example, a student who wants to bring his/her lunch but may wish to purchase juice to drink will be charged \$0.50 for the juice only.

HOMEWORK

One of the more popular features of ParentsWeb is having online access to Homework assignments. This is especially helpful if a student has missed a day of classes due to illness. Please note that homework assignments may change from the assignment originally posted in ParentsWeb. There are times when a faculty member may change the homework assignment during the day due to classroom experience of a particular day. The student's homework agenda/planner remains the primary source for homework assignments.

ATTENDANCE

Another item that can be viewed online is your student's attendance record. Please note that attendance is taken at All Saints in morning homebase. If a student leaves or arrives later in the day, the information may not be recorded in RenWeb, and as a result, may not be updated online. This is an area we plan to address at a later date.
