

## REMINDERS ABOUT ARRIVING IN THE MORNING

Our school provides supervision for students beginning at 7:30 am each morning. PS-1st grade students who arrive between 7:30-7:45 am are asked to go to the PS/PK Arcade hallway. 2nd-4th grade students who arrive between 7:30-7:45 am are asked to go to the 3rd/4th grade Arcade hallway. MS students who arrive between 7:30-7:45 am report to the MS hallways closest to their respective lockers. At 7:45 am, all students are dismissed to their respective classrooms.

Prior to 7:30 am, the school does not have faculty assigned to supervise students. Prior to 7:30, faculty and staff are arriving on campus themselves, and taking care of their morning tasks as they ready for their professional day.

Finally, please note, that if your student arrives late on campus during chapel/announcements (8:00-8:30 am) he or she will need to go to Hanslik gym as soon as he or she arrives. We do not have school staff in the classrooms during chapel and announcements, and students/parents should not wait in the classroom until chapel/announcements conclude.
