GRANDPARENTS AND SPECIAL FRIENDS DAY IS FRIDAY, OCTOBER 13

Grandparents and Special Friends Day is a long-standing tradition at All Saints. The annual event provides the opportunity for our students to share their All Saints experiences with grandparents, other relatives, or special family friends. These intergenerational connections are wonderful opportunities for learning and growth.



Remember, Grandparents and Special Friends Day is a dress uniform day for our students. We look forward to seeing our entire All Saints family come together on this very special day.

Q: Do parents attend?

A: YES! This is a great family event. Parents are encouraged to attend.

Q: What time does the service begin?

A: The worship service begins at 10:30am. You will want to come early to get the best seat in either Patriot Gym (site of the service) or the Kirby Commons. The service is live-streamed onto the big screen in Kirby Commons, home of the most comfortable seats on campus!

Q: What happens during the service?

A: It follows the basic order of our regular Morning Prayer service, and includes much more! Featured are musical offerings from our Band, Choirs, and Orchestra. Preschool and Pre-Kindergarten students make an appearance as well. Reflections by grade level representatives are a treasured part of the morning. Scripture readings by students and a brief homily from the chaplain are also a part of our time together.

Q: My child's grandparents cannot attend. What should we do?

A: If your child does not have grandparents who are able to attend the service, families might consider if there is a special friend who could be asked. Perhaps there are special neighbors, godparents, or an aunt or uncle who might want to join in on the fun. In addition, parents are always special at All Saints!

Q: Where do guests park?

A: The school parking lots are available, and additional parking and shuttle service will be available from 8:30am-1:15pm in the Aldersgate United Methodist Church across Indiana Avenue. *Early arrival is recommended.*

Q: Do classes resume after lunch?

A: Friday, October 13 is a full day. Students are expected to return to class at 1:00pm. Any student leaving campus will need to be signed out by an adult through the school office.

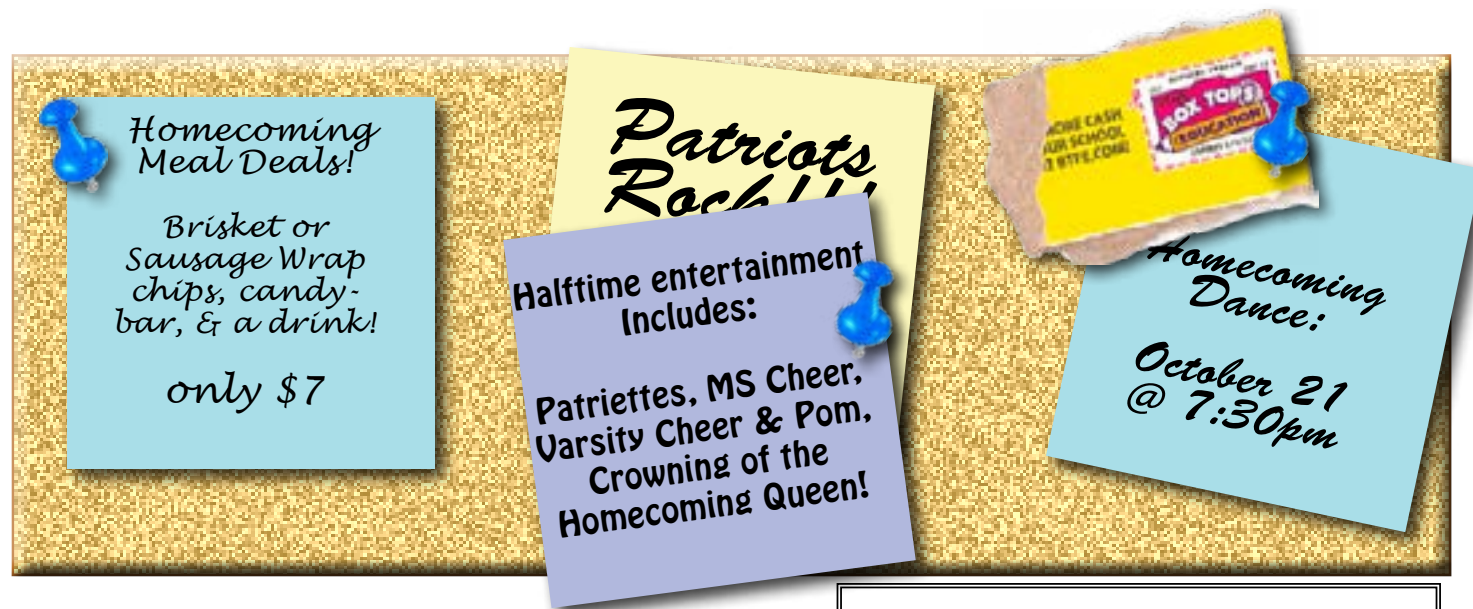

The high school varsity has yet to drop a set sweeping Christ the King (twice), Plainview Christian and Southercrest. They will play at PCA this Friday at 4:30 pm (JV) and 6:00 pm (Var.), and they will conclude district play next Tuesday, October 17th at Southercrest with 5:00 pm (JV) and 6:30 pm (Var.)



Cross Country continues to run well for both the middle school and high school. Strong showings this past week for the high school included **Ret Taylor** with an individual third place finish at the O'Donnell Romp Through the Park season-ending race in Lamesa.

All Saints will host district foe Holy Cross Catholic next Friday, October 20 at 4:00 pm for All Saints' Homecoming. It should be a great afternoon and evening at All Saints.

Middle School Football picked up their first win of the season with a victory over the Ropes 7th grade team in between rainstorms. It was good and several of the Patriots got in on the scoring action. All Saints will host Christ the King Thursday, October 14 at 4:00 pm for their last home game of the season.
