All Saints High School is proud to announce that its 25-member Class of 2018 has three seniors receiving honors by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. Two of the seniors have been named National Merit Semifinalists while one senior has been designated as a Commended Scholar.

Natalie Chaudhuri and *Colten Cannon* were named as National Merit Semifinalists and are eligible to continue in the 63rd annual National Merit Scholarship competition for scholarships worth more than \$32 million to be awarded next spring. *Sarah Going* was named as a National Merit Commended Scholar, which makes her a candidate for Special Scholarships sponsored by corporations and businesses.

As members of All Saints third graduating class, *Chaudhuri*, *Cannon*, and *Going* are the first All Saints High School National Merit Scholars in the school's short six-year history. The Lubbock area has 13 total seniors earning the National Merit Semifinalist status. The three All Saints seniors scored among the highest 2016 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) scores in Texas.

"Students who are recognized by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation share two characteristics: academic talent and an exceptional work ethic. This is definitely true of *Natalie [Chaudhuri]*, *Colten [Cannon]*, and *Sarah [Going]*," All Saints Headmaster *Bruce Latta* said. "What's more impressive is the fact that all three have taken full advantage of the extra-curricular opportunities at All Saints. They are active in all aspects of school life. Finally, and most importantly, they are exceptional people and wonderful representatives of both All Saints and Lubbock."

To be considered for a Merit Scholarship Finalist award, *Chaudhuri* and *Cannon* along with the other semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the Finalist level of the competition. About 90 percent of the Semifinalists are expected to attain Finalist standing, and about half of the Finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar title.

"These three students are members of our third graduating class. We are so blessed to have such a wonderful and thriving high school program," All Saints High School Division Head said. "Our faculty is dedicated to the success of All Saints High School and all of our students. I congratulate these students in particular on their great accomplishments, both with this honor, as well as in everything they do. All of our students at All Saints High School are very involved and committed to learning and growing, both in and out of the classroom."

Cannon is the secretary of the school's Student Council as well as historian for the school Chemistry Club. He is a member of the National Honor Society and participates in varsity football, basketball, track, golf, and cross country. *Cannon* has been enrolled at All Saints since the seventh grade. He is the son of *Mr. Shawn Cannon* and *Mrs. Emily Cannon*.

Chaudhuri is president of the school's Chemistry Club, captain of the Debate Team, treasurer of the Student Council, editor of the school's *Merkati* literary magazine, and editor of the school's newsletter, *The Patrioteer*. She is a member of the Varsity Mock Trial Team, High School Band, Future Problem Solver Team, Varsity Tennis Team, and High School Book Club. *Chaudhuri* received the school's highest award – the Proven Patriot Award for Overall Excellence- her freshman, sophomore, and junior years. *Chaudhuri* has been enrolled at All Saints since the sixth grade. She is the daughter of *Dr. Kallol Chaudhuri* and *Dr. Swapna Chaudhuri*.


Going is the Senior Class Student Council Representative and is also a member of the Varsity Cheer Team, Mock Trial Team, Varsity Tennis Team, Chemistry Club, National Honor Society, Yearbook Staff, and Band. *Going* enrolled in All Saints her freshman year. She is the daughter of *Mr. Scott Going* and *Mrs. Robin Going*.

"*Colten [Cannon]*, *Natalie [Chaudhuri]*, and *Sarah [Going]* are so deserving of this honor," All Saints High School Counselor *Gwen Belk* said. "They are exceptional young people who possess extraordinary skills. We are so very proud of their achievements."

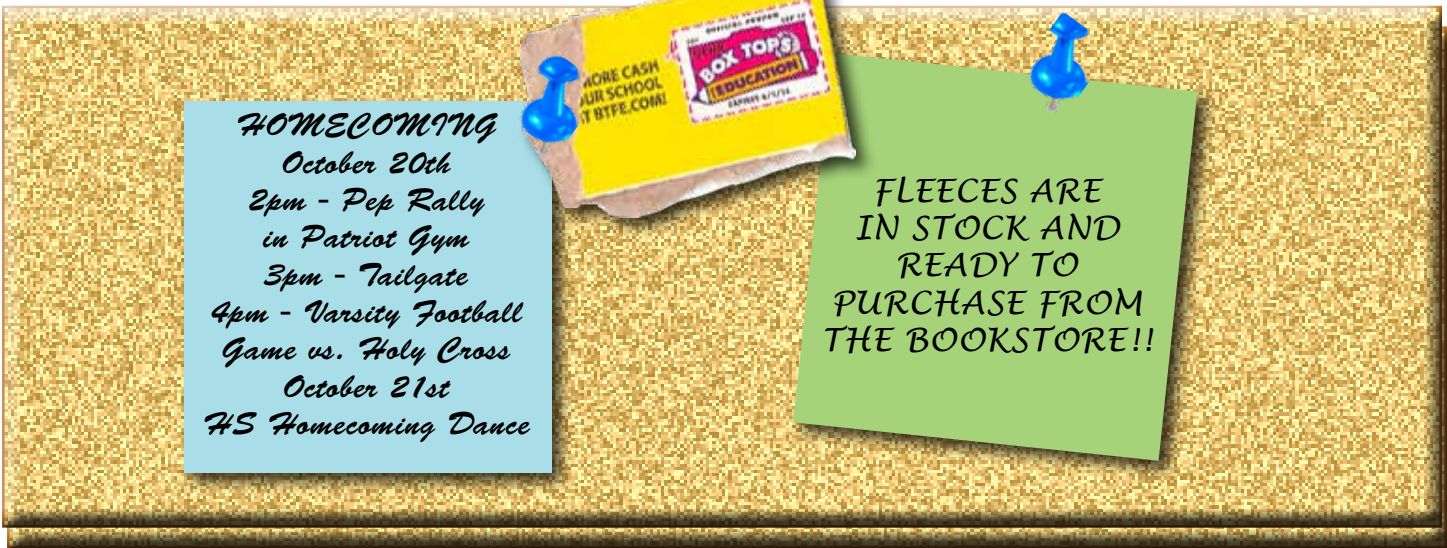
God's blessings to each of you as we move into Fall. It is a great time to be a part of God's creation, as we watch it transform before us daily!

Reese and Logan Wolfe

Two All Saints students were given the opportunity to take a really cool mission trip this past summer. **Reese** (5th grade) and **Logan** (1st grade) **Wolfe** along with their parents traveled to the remote area of Metlakatla, Alaska located on Annette Island with The Isaiah Connection and their local church. The mission of this organization is to provide worldwide life changing, Christ centered, mission opportunities by connecting teens and adults in communities around the world.



This particular community is populated by Tsinshian Indians who traveled there from Canada. The kids experienced a much different climate than what they are use to in Lubbock. It rains around 275 inches a year. The Native children are not able to get out and enjoy outdoor activities. **Reese** and **Logan** were able to work alongside high school students and adults to host a basketball camp in the morning, and participate in Vacation Bible School every afternoon. The evenings were spent hanging out with the youth and having team devotionals. **Reese** and **Logan** had a wonderful time, developed friendships, and learned a lot about the Tsinshian Indian culture. They are excited to share what they've learned! If you see **Reese** and **Logan**, be sure to ask them about their trip!

Jackson Drake

We are so proud of **Jackson Drake** and his hard work and dedication! **Jackson**, a sophomore golfer at ASHS, played in the invitation only Junior PGA Championship, Ben Hogan Junior Cup, and the Texas State Juniors Championship last summer.

"The Junior PGA Championship was my first national tournament and I hope not my last," **Drake** said. "It was such an awesome experience to play at that level and to compete against the best golfers in America as well as compete on one of the toughest courses."

Drake won two big tournaments earlier in the year making him eligible for the elite championships. "I took first at the San Antonio Open this summer as well as first at the All America Dallas this summer," he said. "I also had the opportunity to represent North Texas Junior PGA and compete in the Ben Hogan Junior Cup where the top golfers in the North compete against the top golfers from the South in match play." **Drake's** team, the North, won the championship.

"I have had the privilege of having two great golf coaches," he said. "**Leon Von Rensburg** [All Saints Coach and Pro Golfer] crafted my swing and has been instrumental in helping me become the golfer I am today. **Leon** coached me for five years. Recently I've been taking lessons from **JJ Killeen** [All Saints parent and Pro Golfer] and I'm really enjoying pushing my golf to the next level."

He played in his first tournament when he was ten years old. "My very first tournament was a scramble with my Dad in Brady, Texas," he said. "We didn't win, but we built great memories." Since then he has played in many tournaments, including playing for All Saints. "I have played as a Patriot since the sixth grade. Last year, my freshman year, our golf team won the State 2-A TAPPS Championship Title," he said. "I'm proud to be an All Saints Patriot." It's going to be fun to see what's next for **Jackson** and the All Saints Golf team.

COACHES CORNER

All Saints Cross Country is off and running in a big way for both the middle school and high school teams. Twenty nine runners represented All Saints this past weekend at the Plains Invitational at Yokum County Park. Seventh grader **Allison Aiken** won the middle school girls race with a two-mile time of 14:01. **Emori Tran**, **Jilayne Headrick**, **Ellis Fox** and **Jaci Donaldson** also finished well for the young Patriots. Seventh grader **Lee Taylor** was second in the boys two-mile race posting an impressive 12:20. **Joseph Paone**, **Will Aiken**, and **Caden Mead** also came in under the 15:00 minute mark, which is great for middle school.



On the high school side **Ret Taylor** continued his outstanding season finishing second in the 5K varsity boys race running 17:37. **Gage Clary** (3), **Ash Bumstead** (4), **Sebastian Whitaker** (11) and **Vincent Paone** (12) all medaled in the high school boys' junior varsity 5K race. For the girls **Lily McKay** led the way with a personal best for the season of 14:47 in the two-mile varsity girls' race.



The middle school and high school cross country teams will run this Saturday, September 16th, in the LCU Chap Invite.

Middle School Volleyball hosted Lubbock Christian on Monday and it was an exciting night of volleyball in Jones Gym. The 7th grade team went down at the end of a closely contested match, but showed great competitiveness. The 8th grade team lost a match to the Lubbock Christian blue team and then won a second match against the Lubbock Christian gold team. Middle School Volleyball will play Thursday at 5:00 pm (7th) & 6:00 pm (8th) at Cumberland Presbyterian vs. Southcrest.



High School Volleyball continues its gauntlet of tough matches leading into the opening of district play on September 29th. They dropped a tough five-set match to Midland Classical (state-ranked 6th in TAPPS 3A) on the road and then another tough five-setter to Denver City (state-ranked 18th in UIL 3A). Both the junior varsity and varsity will play Friday against 4A Midland Trinity in Midland.



ASHS EARNS STATE RUNNER-UP

In just its first year in the 2-A division, All Saints High School finished as state runner-up in the 2016-2017 Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) race for the prized Henderson Championship Cup recognizing excellence in academics, athletics and fine arts competitions. All Saints was named as the number one high school in TAPPS 1-A in 2015-2016 and won the Henderson Championship Cup. All Saints is the only independent school in the Lubbock area to win the prestigious Henderson Championship Cup in recent years and then to be recognized again the following year after moving up a division.

All Saints High School earned 58 points to finish in second place behind Henderson Cup champion Shriner St. Paul's Catholic School with 81 points. Waco Live Oak Classical School finished in third place with 56 points. TAPPS 2-A classification is comprised of 46 private schools across Texas.

All Saints' athletic teams contributed the majority of the points toward the Henderson Cup with three team state championships and three team state runner-up finishes. In addition to the team success, 11 athletes were chosen First Team All State, 19 were chosen as Second Team All State and 24 were awarded Academic All State honors. The Fine Arts department contributed with a One Act Play regional championship while the Academics Department contributed with two state championships and three state runner-up titles.

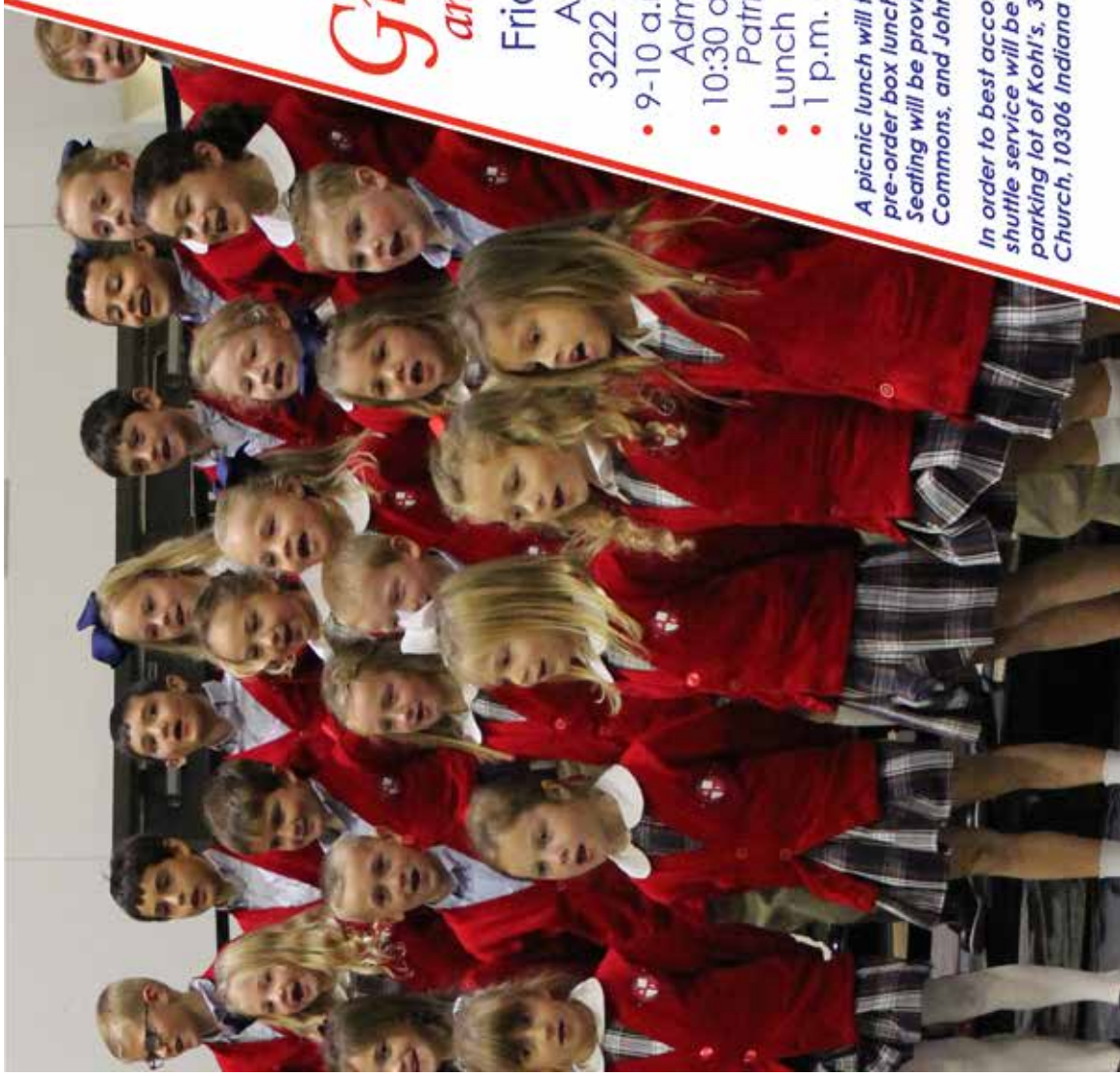
