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Graduation Requirements

Graduation requirements include credits in English (4), Mathematics (4), Social Studies (4), Science (4), World Languages (3), Fine Arts (1), PE or CA (1), Professional Communication (1/2), and Electives (4 1/2).

In addition to the academic requirements, All Saints students are required to participate in a minimum of 60 hours in community service projects.

Students perform community service with organizations such as the Salvation Army, Meals on Wheels, American Cancer Society Hope Lodge, Ronald McDonald House, the YWCA, and Toys for Tots. During high school, students participate in a tour of Texas colleges and universities and focus on college and career readiness.

The junior and senior years focus on college and career programs and admissions.

School and Community

- For over sixty years, All Saints Episcopal School has set the standard for private education in the community of Lubbock, Texas. All Saints Episcopal High School opened its doors in August, 2012 with a commitment to providing a college preparatory program including rigorous academics, quality fine arts, and competitive athletics in a modern facility led by highly qualified instructors. All Saints Episcopal High School is accredited by the Southwestern Association of Episcopal Schools and the Texas Education Agency.
- All Saints alumni become leaders in their university environments, with many students receiving top academic, athletic and extracurricular honors and awards.
- Chapel services are an integral part of the All Saints experience. We honor each student as an individual and respect his or her own spiritual journey. Our chapel program is designed to nurture the spiritual life of all students.
- The Advent Season is celebrated by our students with Advent community service projects. All grade levels participate in Advent projects.
- Since 1995, 100 percent of All Saints alumni have been accepted into college.
- In the last eleven years, 11 area high school valedictorians and salutatorians attended All Saints.
- High school expansion began in August, 2012 with the addition of grade 9. Grade 10 was added in August, 2013. Grade 11 was added in August, 2014. Grade 12 was added in August, 2015.
- Initial enrollment in the High School in August, 2012 was six students. At the present time, the High School enrollment has grown to 75 students.
- Graduation for the inaugural graduating class was held on May 20, 2016. Twelve students graduated and garnered \$1 million in scholarships.
- May 19, 2017 marked the second graduation for All Saints Episcopal School. Eleven students graduated and were awarded \$2 million in scholarships.
- The Class of 2018 included two National Merit Finalists, one Hispanic Scholar and one Commended National Merit student. The class of 24 students earned \$5.3 million in merit scholarships.
- Twenty-two students graduated in May 2019, including one Commended National Merit Student. \$4.7 million was awarded in scholarships.

- This will serve as confirmation that All Saints Episcopal School does not rank our students. The only students that receive an official ranking are the students who are valedictorian and salutatorian. The official cumulative grade point average is included on each transcript.
- In order to be considered for valedictorian and salutatorian, students must be enrolled at All Saints Episcopal High School for two complete years prior to graduation.
- All grades made during both semesters of grades nine - twelve will be used to determine grade point average. Additionally, Algebra 1 in grade 8 and World Languages taken in grades seven and eight will be used to determine grade point average. All subjects in which a numerical grade is given shall be used to determine valedictorian and salutatorian.

- All Saints High School students excel academically as they continue in our proven program through the twelfth grade. Students are held accountable to high expectations in the classroom as they enjoy a rigorous curriculum, including Pre-Advanced Placement and Advanced Placement courses. The block schedule, small seminar-style classes and unique learning opportunities enrich the educational experience at All Saints.
- Beginning in the fall of 2017, All Saints Episcopal School began offering the AP Capstone program. College Board's AP Capstone is an innovative and engaging college-level program for high school students that compliments and enhances discipline-specific AP courses. Two AP Capstone courses were added to the curriculum. AP Seminar was added in the fall of 2017. AP Research was added in the fall of 2018. These courses will require students to analyze, plan, conduct, propose solutions, produce communication in various forms, collaborate for problem solving, integrate, synthesize and make cross-curricular connections.
